As the year 2025 has come to an end, it is important to pause and say "thank you" to all of you who comprise KFUMC for your support of the Soul Soup ministry, which is in its 13th year. As a supporter of our church, you have ensured this ministry has the physical spaces necessary to prepare and serve meals. You have supported our guests and volunteers with your prayers and for many of you, with your service. Many have donated to the financial support of this important work. On average, it takes about \$200 a week to purchase food and other supplies so we can prepare and serve anywhere from 80 to 120 meals. This past year we have served nearly 3200 meals!



Feeding the hungry is something we at KFUMC have been called to do through Soul Soup and our support of the Food Bank and, more recently, hungry kids at school. Keep up the good work!!


