Uncertain what it might be like as the weather cools off. One of our regular guests, Wesley, has been diagnosed with a recurrence of bone cancer. His health care professionals are still working on the extent of the recurrence and what the treatment plan will be. Please keep him and all our guests in your prayers.

The Adult Sunday School class is off and running as of September 14 with 16 participants so far. The book we are studying is “The Case for Grace” by Lee Strobel. - If we must evacuate the building for fire or some other emergency, we want to know how many people to locate. Sign in before worship, and if an emergency happens, meet us on the church lawn between the parking lot and the garage.

Certified Lay Servant Ministries



Perhaps you have felt God calling you to become more involved in your local church and community. Or perhaps you have discerned the need to develop your leadership skills. If so, Lay Servant Ministries courses can help you.

Lay Servant Ministries courses / Learning & Leading courses will prepare you for a multitude of missions and ministries, or improve your teaching and leadership skills, guide you in improving your devotional time, help you become an accountable disciple, or help you develop confidence in leading prayer.

Laity who are interested in formalized training and certification for their ministry roles may consider certification through Lay Servant Ministries. There are four different certifications available:

- Certified Lay Servant
- Certified Lay Speaker
- Certified Lay Minister
- Hispanic Lay Missioner.

Completing online classes, receiving the recommendation of your pastor, and being approved by Church Council or Charge Conference are some of the required steps.
